ATLANTA — No. 4 Clemson defeated Georgia Tech, 41-10, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium on Labor Day night. Clemson's special teams had a superlative performance, as Carson Donnelly and Wade Woodaz both blocked punts to give Clemson multiple punt blocks in a single game for the first time since 2007.

Clemson's defense made an impact on the game's first play from scrimmage, as pressure from defensive end K.J. Henry resulted in safety Andrew Mukuba's first career interception.

In the second quarter, after its first punt block, Clemson opened the scoring on a one-yard touchdown run by running back Will Shipley. Clemson then drove 67 yards in eight plays and extended the lead on a six-yard touchdown pass from quarterback DJ Uiagalelei to wide receiver Beaux Collins. Clemson would carry a 14-3 lead into halftime.

Georgia Tech drew to within four on a 13-yard touchdown pass early in the third quarter. The Tiger offense provided a quick answer to take a 17-10 lead, as B.T. Potter hit a 29-yard field goal with 5:41 to play in the third quarter, capping a 12-play, 63-yard drive.

The field goal started Clemson's run of 27 unanswered points down the stretch to earn the win. Potter converted field goal attempts of 29 and 32 yards, and the first-team offense added rushing touchdowns by Uiagalelei and Shipley before ceding to the second unit, when true freshman quarterback Cade Klubnik led Clemson 66 yards and found Will Taylor in the end zone for a three-yard touchdown pass, pushing the final margin to 41-10.

CLEMSON, S.C. — No. 5/4 Clemson scored touchdowns on five of its first six drives in a 35-12 win against Furman. Clemson debuted new renovations to Memorial Stadium, including its 7,100-plus-square-foot videoboard, on a cool, overcast afternoon.

The win was Clemson's 35th consecutive victory at home, only the 15th home winning streak of 35 games or more in FBS history.

Quarterback DJ Uiagalelei completed 21-for-27 passes for 231 yards for a career-high 166.7 passer rating. Clemson rushed for 147 yards on 28 carries, led by Will Shipley, who scored two touchdowns.

Clemson's defense held Furman to 12 points, forced two turnovers and recorded two fourth-down stops. The unit registered nine tackles for loss. Five different Clemson players registered at least seven tackles, including LaVonta Bentley, who had three tackles for loss.

Clemson scored touchdowns on each of its first three possessions with two touchdown runs by Shipley bookending a two-yard touchdown pass from Uiagalelei to Jake Briningstool, giving the Tigers a 21-3 lead early in the second quarter. The teams traded touchdowns in the final two minutes of the first half to enter halftime with a 28-9 Clemson advantage.

Clemson opened the second half with a stop on Barrett Carter's first career interception. On the ensuing drive, Beaux Collins toe-tapped a nine-yard pass from Uiagalelei in the right side of the end zone to give Clemson a 35-9 lead. Furman added a field goal with 48 seconds to play in the third quarter, and a scoreless fourth quarter resulted in the 35-12 final score.

CLEMSON, S.C. — Sophomore running back Will Shipley rushed 12 times for a career-high 139 yards and two touchdowns as Clemson used a 35-point second half in a 48-20 victory over Louisiana Tech. Clemson gained 521 total yards, including 280 on the ground, and forced four turnovers, leading to 21 Tiger points.

The Tigers' defense kept the Bulldogs out of the end zone for the first three quarters and held Louisiana Tech to only six total rushing yards. Quarterback DJ Uiagalelei was 17-of-29 for 221 yards and two scores through the air and picked up 62 yards on the ground on nine carries.

Clemson scored on eight of its 13 drives, not including running out the clock on its final possession. With the game set at 13-6 entering the second half, Clemson exploded for three touchdowns, including a twice scoring 32-yard touchdowns on one-play drives.

Shipley's performance made him the first Clemson player on record back to 1950 to score multiple rushing touchdowns in each of the first three games of a season. He averaged 11.6 yards per carry and became the first Clemson player to average at least 10 yards per carry on at least 10 attempts since Travis Etienne in the 2020 ACC Championship Game against Notre Dame.

R.J. Mickens, Jeremiah Trotter Jr. and Malcolm Greene all recorded interceptions in the contest, while Kevin Swint recorded his first career fumble recovery on a wild snap.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – No. 5 Clemson earned a dramatic double-overtime win at No. 21/16 Wake Forest, 51-45. Quarterback DJ Uiagalelei completed 26-of-41 passes for a season-high 371 passing yards and a career-high five touchdown passes in the win.

Clemson accumulated 559 total yards. The Tigers converted 16-of-23 third downs, breaking the school record of 15 third down conversions set against Western Carolina in 1983.

Clemson ran out to an early 14-0 lead on touchdown passes from Uiagalelei in the first quarter. Two Wake Forest touchdowns and two B.T. Potter field goals brought the halftime score to 20-14.

A prolific third quarter by Wake Forest with three touchdown passes gave the Demon Deacons a 35-28 lead entering the fourth quarter. Down 38-35, Potter nailed a 52-yarder with 4:01 remaining in regulation and the Clemson defense then held to force overtime.

The teams traded touchdowns and two-point conversions in the first overtime. Uiagalelei then hit Davis Allen for Allen's second touchdown of the game in the second overtime. A beleaguered Clemson secondary then sealed the win with a fourth-down pass breakup on Wake Forest's possession to give the Tigers their first road overtime win since 2009.

CLEMSON, S.C. – In the first Top 10 matchup in the 90-game history of the Clemson-NC State rivalry, No. 5 Clemson defeated No. 10 NC State at an electric, sold-out Memorial Stadium. Clemson recorded its 37th consecutive home win, tying the longest home winning streak in ACC history.

Clemson's defense recorded three sacks and two turnovers while holding NC State to only 34 rushing yards on 21 carries, the Wolfpack's worst yards-per-carry average (1.6) in ACC play since 2016. Offensively, quarterback DJ Uiagalelei passed for 209 yards and a score and ran for a career-high 73 yards and two touchdowns in the victory.

The teams traded long drives and 20-yard field goals on their opening possessions. NC State took a 10-6 lead in the second quarter, but Uiagalelei drove Clemson 75 yards in 1:20 in a two-minute situation to give Clemson a 13-10 halftime lead.

Coming out of halftime, Clemson forced an NC State three-and-out as Barrett Carter and Myles Murphy both registered sacks. On Clemson's ensuing possession, Uiagalelei rushed 39 yards inside the NC State 10-yard line. Uiagalelei then completed a seven-yard touchdown pass to Jake Briningstool, increasing Clemson's lead to 20-10 early in the third quarter.

Toriano Pride Jr. later recorded his first career interception, setting up B.T. Potter's third field goal of the night to increase Clemson's lead to 23-13. A sneaky playaction bootleg by Uiagalelei for his second rushing touchdown of the night extended the lead to 30-13 until a late NC State touchdown brought the final score to 30-20.

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. – No. 5 Clemson scored touchdowns on either side of halftime to pull away from Boston College, 31-3, at Alumni Stadium. The Tigers held the Eagles to 34 rushing yards, piled up 11 tackles for loss and four sacks, broke up eight passes and registered 13 quarterback hurries in the victory.

The Tigers scored 28 unanswered points in the game's final 31 minutes to earn the victory. Clemson shut out the Eagles in the second half, allowing just 86 total yards after halftime. Clemson's three points allowed were its fewest surrendered in its series with Boston College since 1952 when the Tigers shut out the Eagles at Braves Field.

Defensive end Xavier Thomas earned the Leather Helmet Award as the game's most valuable player after a career-high-tying 2.0 sacks in the victory despite playing only six snaps in his return to action from a foot injury suffered in fall camp.

Quarterback DJ Uiagalelei threw for 220 yards and three scores and led the Tigers in rushing for a second consecutive game with 69 yards on 12 carries.

Running back Will Shipley gave Clemson a 10-3 advantage with 45 seconds to play in the first half. Coming out of half, the Tigers came up with a quick stop and then Uiagalelei led the Tigers 73 yards on five plays, hitting Joseph Ngata in stride for a 38-yard score. Clemson added to its lead on the first play of the fourth quarter, as Uiagalelei found Beau Collins alone in the end zone for a 10-yard score to push the lead to 24-3.

Uiagalelei hit Brannon Spector for a 13-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, his third touchdown pass of the day to his third different receiver. Uiagalelei had a key rush during the series, picking up 40 yards on third-and-3 to help set up the score.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – No. 4/5 Clemson scored 17 points in a two-minute span on either side of halftime to take command of a 34-28 win at Florida State. Running back Will Shipley tallied a career-best 238 all-purpose yards (121 rushing, 48 receiving, 69 kickoff return).

Defensively, Clemson allowed touchdowns on two of the first three drives before settling in and holding the Seminoles scoreless for its next six drives, which included three fourth-down stops. Myles Murphy had six tackles, including 3.5 for loss, and two sacks.

DJ Uiagalelei accounted for four total touchdowns (three passing, one rushing), was 15-of-23 through the air for 203 yards, and added a five-yard rushing touchdown.

After Florida State struck first, Uiagalelei avoided a sack, stepped up in the pocket, and threw a 59-yard touchdown to Antonio Williams on Clemson's second drive.

The Seminoles took a 14-7 lead on a 15-play, 93-yard touchdown drive, but Clemson responded with 27 consecutive points to take a 34-14 lead, as tight ends Jake Briningstool and Davis Allen added scores in addition to Uiagalelei's touchdown on the ground. B.T. Potter also added field goals 47 yards and 34 yards, and with his second extra point of the game, he passed Chandler Catanzaro (404 from 2010-13) to become the highest-scoring kicker in Clemson history.

The Seminoles scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to bring the score to 34-28. Brannon Spector then recovered a Florida State onside kick attempt, enabling Clemson to run out the clock for the win.

CLEMSON, S.C. — No. 5 Clemson overcame four turnovers and an early 14-point deficit to earn a 27-21 win against No. 14 Syracuse at Memorial Stadium. The victory was Clemson's 38th in a row at home, breaking the ACC record set by Florida State from 1992-2001.

Running back Will Shipley had another career day, recording 242 all-purpose yards including a career-high 172 rushing yards on a career-high 27 carries with two touchdowns to spark Clemson's 293 rushing yards. Clemson's defense recorded a season-high five sacks and shut out the Orange in the second half as Clemson scored 20 unanswered points for the win.

Clemson took a 7-0 lead on a one-yard touchdown run by Shipley on its opening possession. Syracuse responded with a 75-yard touchdown drive to tie the game at seven.

Clemson's next two possessions resulted in turnovers. Ja'Had Carter intercepted DJ Uiagalelei to terminate one possession, and on Clemson's next drive, the Tigers drove to the Syracuse three-yard line, but Carter returned an Uiagalelei fumble 90 yards for a 14-7 Syracuse lead. A Garrett Shrader touchdown run later in the quarter pushed the Orange to a 21-7 lead. BT Potter cut the Clemson deficit to 21-10 with a 44-yard field goal before halftime.

A scoreless third quarter was not without drama. After Uiagalelei's second interception of the day, Clemson inserted Cade Klubnik at quarterback. Klubnik and the Clemson ground game led Clemson to touchdown drives of 80 yards and 61 yards to give Clemson a 24-21 lead. An additional Potter field goal and a game-winning interception by R.J. Mickens sealed the 26-21 victory.

The win was Clemson's first in a game in which it trailed by 11 or more points in the fourth quarter since the 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl against LSU.

NOTRE DAME, Ind. – Notre Dame took advantage of a pair of non-offensive touchdowns and an interception deep in Tiger territory that led to another score to defeat No. 5/5 Clemson, 35-14, at Notre Dame Stadium. The loss snapped Clemson's nation-leading 14-game winning streak. Earlier in the evening, by virtue of Pitt's win over Syracuse, Clemson clinched a place in the ACC Championship Game, which takes place in Charlotte on Dec. 3.

With 9:08 left in the first quarter, Notre Dame's Prince Kollie returned a blocked punt 17 yards for a Notre Dame touchdown. The Irish would score another touchdown with 38 seconds left in the first half, making the score 14-0 at the half.

Cade Klubnik entered the game at quarterback with 1:30 left in the third quarter, but an interception on his first pass attempt gave Notre Dame the ball on the Clemson 14-yard line. The Irish scored three plays later to take a 21-0 lead.

DJ Uiagalelei returned at quarterback on Clemson's following possession and led the Tigers 56 yards before Benjamin Morrison intercepted his pass and returned it 96 yards for a touchdown, increasing Notre Dame's lead to 28-0 with 12:58 left to play. Running back Will Shipley got the Tigers on the scoreboard with 10:14 left in the fourth quarter, punching the ball into the end zone with a one-yard rushing touchdown.

Notre Dame added one more touchdown with 4:16 left in the fourth quarter, and Clemson scored the game's final points when Uiagalelei threw a four-yard touchdown pass to Joseph Ngata.

The contest marked Clemson's first time since 2007 surrendering touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams in a single game.

CLEMSON, S.C. – No. 12 Clemson clinched the final ACC Atlantic Division crown outright with a 31-16 victory against Louisville on Nov. 12. The win extended Clemson's home winning streak six full calendar years since its last home loss.

Wide receiver Antonio Williams registered a career-high 106 all-purpose yards including 83 yards on a Clemson-freshman-record-tying 10 receptions and added a six-yard pass completion as well. Running backs Phil Mafah (106 yards) and Will Shipley (97) led the Tigers to 248 rushing yards on the day.

Clemson's defense registered four sacks and nine tackles for loss. Linebacker Barrett Carter posted eight tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and an interception. He became the first player in the country to register at least 3.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and an interception in a game between Power Five teams since 2011.

DJ Uiagalelei opened the scoring with an 11-yard rushing touchdown on Clemson's opening drive, and a B.T. Potter field goal extended the lead to 10. A touchdown run by Tiyon Evans got the Cardinals on the board early in the second quarter, but a touchdown pass from Uiagalelei to Williams put Clemson up 17-7 at the half.

Shipley extended Clemson's lead on a highlight reel 25-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, hurdling a defender at the 10-yard line and splitting two more for the score. After a Louisville field goal, Mafah helped seal the victory in the fourth quarter with a 39-yard touchdown for Clemson late in the fourth quarter. Louisville threw a touchdown pass on the game's final play to bring the final score to 31-16.
